Schaffhausen, 2 September 2019 – IWC Schaffhausen's international motorsport team participated in its second Arosa ClassicCar event this weekend. Racing driver Bernd Schneider skilfully drove the Mercedes-Benz 300 SL "Gullwing" for the Swiss watchmaking company on the route from Langwies to Arosa at the 15th edition of the hill climb event.

The stunning Graubünden mountains provide the perfect backdrop for the extraordinary vehicles participating in the Arosa ClassicCar race. The 15th edition of the international hill climb for historic sports and racing cars attracted around 27,000 spectators. The breathtaking historic vehicles and fantastic driving performances are what draw so many fans to this unique event in Arosa year after year. A total of 162 drivers participated in the 2019 event.
