Burmester has been sporting the 41-millimetre Pilot's Watch Chronograph 41 TOP GUN "Oceana" (Ref. IW389404). Perfectly complementing the surrounding landscape,

the monochromatic timepiece features a rich blue ceramic case with a matching dial and rubber strap with a denim inlay. Golf is a game of precision and concentration where every move is carefully calculated, making these chronographs the excellent performance companions. Both timepieces are powered by the IWC-manufactured 69380 calibre that is engineered with focus on robustness, reliability, and durability. With their bold, luminescent hands and numerals, they also offer enhanced readability at all hours of the day.
